This is very dangerous pactice which can certainly lead to Fitnah (Disaster).

Hence it was compulsory upon the Holy Prophet Muuhammad (S.A.W.) to teach the Holy Quraan to the People so that they can understand it, even though the Holy Quraan was revealed in Arabic and the language of the people was Arabic, and the Arabs were the direct Addressee of the Holy Quraan, Yet they were not left to understand the Holy Quraan in the way they wanted to. The Prophet Muuhammad (S.A.W.) was commanded by Allah to teach it to them and they had to learn from Him. This was done to prevent the people from giving the wrong interpretations to the verses of the Holy Quraan by giving their own ideas and opinionns. To seek the understanding of the Islamic Shari'ah (Which is actually Fiqh) is so important that Allah Himself speaks about it in the Holy Quraan by using the word YAFQAHOONA to the knowledge of FIQH.

Islaam is not only to be learnt but to be understood, it is quite possible to learn something but that does not mean that we have

understood it.

This is what is meant by FIQH to understand the SHARIAH (The Laws of Islaam).

Without the knowledge of Figh the Penal Code (Hudood) and

the Death Penalty (Qisaas) can never be understood,

Without Figh the flame of Faith and Light of Islamm will be put out

forever and forever.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FIGH

When we speak about figh we are actually speaking about the understanding of Islaam, Figh in no way confines itself to Islaamic jurisprudence but in fact it is general.

To seek the knowlege of Islaam in every possible way, whether it is Ibaadah (worship) Maa'aashiraat (living in society) or Ma'mallaat

(dealings annd trade.)

Flqh literally means to understand, wether it be the Holy Qurann, the Hadeeth (the words and life of the last Messenger of Allah Muhammad S.A.W.) or whatever, Teachnically Figh refers to the knowledge of the Ahkaam of the sharia'h (the commands of the Islaamic law) So when we say to learn Figh it means to learn the Ahkaam of Allah (commandments of Allah) to know what is Halaal (Lawful) and abstain from what is Haraam (unlawful)". If we look around today we can never find a more pious person than that person who practices upon the Halaal and abstain from the Haraam. Today mankind is suuffering from a disease and weakness even thouugh we know fully well the things our master and creator has warned against, we happpily and shamelessly indulge in it e.g. Lack of knowledge can be rectified by seeking knowledge, carelessness and negligence, by practising commandments of Allah and abstaining from Haraam (Unlawful and prohibited) Thisngs.

In every commandment of Allah and in every saying the Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.) there is a ruling from the Shari'ah (Islamic Law). It can be a compulsory act, obligatory act, an emphasised or unemphasised suunnah (practice of the prophet Muhammad S.A.W.) or it can be something that is Haraam (Forbidden) allowed, not allowed, disliked etc. Also knowing the limits of the Shari'ah e.g. To what extend has the Shari'ah given me permission to do such

and such an act.

The subject of FIQH deals with this and much, much more.

A person who has the knowledge of all these things wold be very

keen and cautionns in his worship and behaviour.

He will worship his Master and Lord with allot more devotion, sincerity and confidence, which will endeavour him to earn the maximum reward and closeness of his Creator. Similarly the knowledge of the Shari'ah (islamic Law) will save a person from falling prey to satanic temptations and influence.

It is for this reason that the Holy Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.) has said, "That one FAQEH (i.e. a person who has acquired the knowledge of Fiqh) is harder on Satan than a Thousand ignorant

worshippers"

It is quuite clear if a person does not have the knowledge of the Islamic Shari'ah he can easily be carried away into his own thoughts COM
